Agape Love & Discipleship

Jesus said, "The world will know that you are my disciple when you agape one another." Love is our badge of discipleship, our authentication. It tells others that we belong to God, that we live in Him and that He lives in us. John speaks of this badge when he wrote: "No-one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us."

From a Biblical perspective love is agape, a love of the will, a love of discipline, which says, "I will love you regardless of whether or not you love me." Agape allows us to love our enemies. It allows God to love us, while we were vet sinners.

In First Corinthians thirteen, Paul breaks agape down into its individual parts:

Love is patient.

Love is kind.

Love does not envy.

Love does not boast.

Love is not proud.

Love is not rude.

Love is not self-seeking.

Love is not easily angered.

Love keeps no record of wrongs.

Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with truth.

Love always protects reputations.

Love trusts, hopes, perseveres.

Love never fails.

Read them again, sixteen aspects of "agape love." Who are we to Love -- Agape? "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself."

Love Self! Yes, self-love is a Bible doctrine. Self-Love is not because of what great things we've done; not because of education, financial status, political correctness etc., self-love comes from what God has done for us.

- He created us in His own image.
- He came to live & die as we live and die.





- His sacrificial death has the potential to save our soul.
- He wants to live in us, and us in Him.

That gives us worth! Amen?

We are to love our neighbors. R. L. Middleton in his book "The Gift of Love" talks about a college chapel service at Randolph Macon College. If you've been around a college any at all, you know that chapel can be a boring occasion at times. Especially when the Dean speaks. The Dean opened his Bible to Luke Chapter 10, read the story of the Good Samaritan, laid his Bible down, walked over beside the podium, and said "Gentlemen, the road from Jerusalem to Jericho runs right through this campus and your dormitory. Chapel dismissed." Indeed, the road from Jerusalem to Jericho runs straight through this church, through our homes, through Walmart, and the office or shop where we work. Amen?

We're to love God. John writes, "This is love for God: to obey His commands. And His commands are not burdensome." Jesus gives us the bottom line for loving God when He said, "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." Do we love Him enough:

- To place Him first in our lives?
- Worship on the Lord's Day?
- Enough to become His instrument of righteousness?
- His living sacrifice?
- To make a genuine effort to live above moral reproach?
- Enough to humble ourselves, confessing our faults, admitting our sins?

We must allow Paul's statements to echo in our hearts daily: "If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give all I possess to the poor and surrender my body to the flames, but have not love, I gain nothing."



For example...
