# The Way to Greatness

They all saw it. It was sitting in plain view. They knew its purpose. They knew it was needed. They all saw it, but no one wanted to be first to put it to use. So, Jesus did.

Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him, Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God, rose from supper. He laid aside his outer aarments. and taking a towel, tied it around his waist. Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him. (John 13:1-5)

The disciples had discussed among themselves which of them was the greatest. A couple of them had even asked Jesus for special status in his new kingdom (Matthew 20:20-28; Mark 10:35-45; Luke 22:24-27). That may be the reason that no one wanted to pick up the towel and the wash basin. How could any of them be considered "great" if they volunteered for the job of a servant? Simon the Zealot may have thought



that tax collector should do it. Peter may have thought it beneath his station as the unofficial leader and spokesman

for the group. Whatever their particular reasons, none of them wanted the position of servant.

We look at this group of men and sometimes wonder why just being next to Jesus for three years wasn't enough. Then we stop and think about ourselves. We all want to be great in some way. We argue with our siblings over who is the favorite child. We



want to be the favorite parent, or to be the parents with the most well-behaved children. We want to be the best grandparents. We want to be the model employee, the MVP.

This can bleed into the church as well. We want to be great. Maybe it is as the leader of some particular ministry, or the one to whom people come for answers, or the best preacher or Bible class teacher, not for the sake of those to whom we minister, but for our own egos.

Jesus knows our desire to be great and points the way to achieving that goal. It's not what we thought it would be. It's not what we hoped it would be. It is not what the world around us tries to tell us it is. It is not success, power, and money. It is service, humility, and love. It is the position of a servant with a towel and a basin of water.

When he had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, "Do you understand what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you. Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them. (John 13:12-17)

This is our call. We are called to serve one another. We do this because we belong to Jesus. We do this because of our status as children of God, our position as followers of Jesus, and being indwelt with the Holy Spirit. We serve out of confidence in that identity. What greater status could we seek?

We are called to serve those around us, all of those around us. Shortly after the foot washing, Judas left the upper room to go and gather the mob that would arrest Jesus. Knowing this would happen, Jesus still washed Judas's feet. It is hard for us to serve those who have hurt us, or those who don't seem eager to serve in return, but we are to look out for the needs of others, whoever they may be.

I love the way John begins this narrative. "Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end." Then after Judas had gone, Jesus gave them this new commandment. "Love one another; just has I have loved you, you also are to love one another." Love is to be the motivation for serving others. You and I can serve others without loving them. But we cannot love them in the way of Jesus without serving them.

We love and serve others because Jesus loved us and served our needs. We desperately needed forgiveness, cleansing, hope, redemption, and healing. We needed a way back to the Father. We needed an atoning sacrifice. We couldn't do it ourselves. So, Jesus did. *"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."* (John 3:16-17)

May God help us to seek greatness in the way demonstrated by Jesus.
