He wished there was a hymn he could have had the young people sing that night that related to this. That evening on his way home he was in deep thought. Arriving at home, he went straight to his desk and penned the words to "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder," and then put it into music. He was later quoted as saying, "I never dared to change a word or note after that." On a sad note, the young girl was not there that night because she was ill and had pneumonia. She died a couple of weeks later, unable to answer another roll call here on earth, but most certainly she was present when her name was called "Up Yonder." Thank you, Lord, for everything you bless us with! We love You!

### **A Servant Mindset**

It was Jesus who said: "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant... I didn't come to be served, but to serve" (Matthew 20.26 & 28). Servanthood! What does that look like? I think Jesus tells us in Luke chapter twenty-two when a dispute arose among the disciples as to who was the greatest, Jesus answered, "The one who serves!"

How did we miss the point? Where did we go wrong?

- We find preachers who preach from an attitude of supremacy, from a pulpit rather than from the mourner's bench...
- Elders who see themselves as a Board of Directors instead of Shepherds of the Flock...
- Deacons who don't know enough Bible to know what the word means...
- Teachers who teach from a position rather than humility...
- Ministry leaders who want to delegate rather than lead.
- Perhaps a membership who says, let the paid staff do it, that's what we pay them for.

Indeed! How did we come to this kind of thinking? We must ask ourselves; what is this serving all about? Jesus tells us: "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant!" Jesus' Kingdom is not of this world because in His Kingdom greatness is found in serving others.


### Let's examine The Mindset of a Servant...

Servants must know who they are. That night in the Upperroom, Jesus served, washed feet. But that footwashing came after these verses: "Jesus knew that the time had come for Him to leave this world and go to the Father. Jesus knew that

the Father had put all things under His power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God" (John 13.1-3). "So He got up, took off His outer garment, wrapped a towel around His waist, poured water into a basin, and began to wash His disciples feet" (vs 4). Jesus knew who He was and what He was here for. Acting on that knowledge, He became a servant, washed feet. Here it is church, those who don't know who they are, are scrambling for titles, positions, thrones. While those who know who they are, are found washing feet, ministering, serving. Here's an interesting question! If our title was taken away today,

would we still be found doing the same Kingdom work? Perhaps if the answer is no, we may be serving out of an improper motive.

**Servants are willing to place others before self.** God is a Servant; placing others, all others, before Himself: "God so loved the world that He



sent His One and Only Son." "God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" John 3.16 & Romans 5.8). Paul made this point in Philippians, when before speaking of Jesus' coming into our world, he wrote: "In humility consider others better than ourselves. Each of you should look not only to your own interest, but to the interest of others" (Philippians 2.3-4). All others? That night, in the Upper-room, Jesus washed the feet of those

who would betray Him and deny Him. Truth is, He washed my feet and yours, amen? Servanthood includes our looking to the needs of others, considering them to be better than ourselves. We can't deny that "loving service" is the heart of Christianity: "As often as you do it to the least of these, you've done it to Me"..."Fulfill the Law of Christ by carrying each other's burdens" (Matthew 25.45 & Galatians 6.2).

Servants don't keep score. Any score cards in your pocket or mine? I wonder what excuse the Twelve used at the Last Supper? You know they saw the washbasin, pitcher, towel. They knew feet needed to be washed. Were they saying: "I did it last time, let someone else wash feet tonight?" Can we hear James and John say, "Mother told us not to, because she had asked for a throne, not a towel?" Listen, aren't we glad that God doesn't work off a score card when it comes to being patient with us, forgiving us, saving us, in spite of our sin failures?



Let me share a story from my hospital chaplaincy days. I was paged to the room of a family who wanted someone from their church to come pray for their family member, in this case a father who was dying. They had called the preacher. His reply was "I don't really remember this man, so I'll not be coming." In tears they sobbed; "chaplain, can you help us?" I told them I would try...

- I called two different churches in their faith system, and was told by one, that the preacher and visitation team were busy that day.
- The other said "our records indicate that this man was baptized, confirmed, and anointed several years ago so he ought to be alright. Chaplain, please pass this word on to the family for us?"

All of us agree that there is something wrong, seriously wrong with this scenario. But before we're too hard on these three responses, we must examine our own excuses for not washing the feet of those God places before us.

- We must never be "too busy..."
- Not found saying, "But I have a tee time..."
- Not "I've gotta watch the Razorbacks play..."
- Not "I don't want to fight the traffic."

Listen, at some point in our spiritual maturity, it's necessary for each of us to grow past being a recipient of the work of the church to start being a participant in it. An attitude of "being served" rather than "serving" is a sure sign of inmaturity.

Church, whatever the excuse might be, let us pass it through the gate of; "What Would Jesus Do?" Can I say this and you not become upset with me? If we think that's an improper question, perhaps it only becomes another excuse. Amen? When it comes to having the heart of a servant, we must take the admonition of Paul, "Let the mind of Christ Jesus be in you."
